## **“Eternity Hangs on Worship” – 10/20/24**

### **Opening Question(s):**

1. What are your top three favorite worship songs?
2. What worship song would you be okay never singing again?

### **Simple Sermon Summary:**

Revelation 14 is broken into 3 main sections:

Section 1 is about the worship of the victorious 144,000 Jewish evangelists who faithfully serve God and His purpose.

Section 2 introduces 3 angels who faithfully carry out their marching orders, providing another opportunity for salvation on earth.

Section 3 details two harvests that will occur: the 7 bowls of God's wrath, and Armageddon .

### **Discussion Questions**

1. What stood out from Sunday's message?
2. Is it important to differentiate between the Seal of God and the Mark of the Beast? Why // Why not?
  - a. Seal = signature / signet
  - b. Mark = branding (as in cattle branding)
3. There are several scenes of worship throughout Revelation:
  - a. Why do you think these scenes are included?
  - b. What's the significance of worship?
4. Revelation 14v6-7 is the only place in scripture where an angel proclaims the Gospel:
  - a. Why is that important in the context of the Great Tribulation?
  - b. Why do you think God entrusted humans w/ the Gospel and not angels?
5. Read Revelation 14v1-13 – in these verses, what evidence (if any) can you point to that would support the idea that God loves humans and provides sufficient warnings about evil and evidence of his goodness?
6. Read Matthew 13v24-30, 36-43 – what parallels do you see between Jesus' teaching and Revelation 14v14-20?
7. The difference between the 144K faithful witnesses and all those who will be harvested for eternal damnation comes down to worship. The 144K faithfully worshipped Jesus as Lord and lived obediently to Him. The others faithfully worshipped the dragon and lived obediently to him. The difference was the object of their worship...
  - a. What would the casual observer say about your worship?
  - b. Who would the casual observer say you worship?
